BACKGROUND

The City solicited bids for the expansion of the Sundial Waste Water Treatment Plant. The Bid opening was held at Milton city Hall at 2:00pm on October 30, 2025.

SUMMARY

City staff and the engineer reviewed the bids for the Sundial Expansion Project. Both recommend the low bidder, J & P Construction Co., Inc.

Total bid amount \$10,027,000.00

Funding for this project will be provided by a combination of Sundial Reserves and State of Florida Revolving Loan Fund. The City of Milton had been approved for up to \$9,000,000 in SRLF funds. Sundial has a total of \$4,128,344 in operating capital and reserves. This creates a total available of \$13,128,344 for the project. Staff recommends use of Sundial Reserves to buy down the loan amount to be more affordable over time. Repayment of the loan is an obligation of Sundial Utilities and not the City of Milton. It is recommended that a minimum of \$1,000,000 be held in reserves for future needs and emergencies. Following award of the bid, staff will work with the project engineers and contractor to value engineer the project, looking to further drive costs down and reduce the loan amount.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends selection of J & P Construction Co., Inc. as the lowest and most responsible bidder and authorize staff to negotiate and execute a contract not to exceed \$10,027,000 for the project.

Bidder has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings, and (2) reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.

Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder does not consider that any further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the determination of this Bid for performance of the Work at the price(s) bid and within the times and in accordance with the other

- G. Bidder is aware of the general nature of the Work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.

PURPOSE and SCOPE OF WORK

The Work is generally described as follows: SUNDIAL WWTP EXPANSION of an operational wastewater treatment plant in accordance with plans and specifications that are included with this solicitation 2025.10 ITB Sundial WWTP Expansion Project.

A. **PROJECT DESCRIPTION:**

The City of Milton is seeking a qualified firm or team to expand the Sundial Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The Project consists of the following:

Installation of vortex grit removal equipment, a 0.25 MGD biological nutrient removal process, an additional aeration basin on the existing BNR unit, a chlorine contact chamber, and a chemical building. Replacement of an existing mechanical screen, biosolids discharge auger, and effluent piping is required. Blowers, compressors, chemical storage and dosing and other accessories are included.

The CONTRACTOR'S bid shall include the purchase of all materials and equipment, including all applicable sales taxes, required to complete the project in its entirety.

The CITY reserves the right to use Value Engineering which may be negotiated after award of the bid.

J. FORCE MAJEURE:

PURPOSE and SCOPE OF WORK

The Work is generally described as follows: SUNDIAL WWTP EXPANSION of an operational wastewater treatment plant in accordance with plans and specifications that are included with this solicitation 2025.10 ITB Sundial WWTP Expansion Project.

A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The City of Milton is seeking a qualified firm or team to expand the Sundial Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The Project consists of the following:

Installation of vortex grit removal equipment, a 0.25 MGD biological nutrient removal process, an additional aeration basin on the existing BNR unit, a chlorine contact chamber, and a chemical building. Replacement of an existing mechanical screen, biosolids discharge auger, and effluent piping is required. Blowers, compressors, chemical storage and dosing and other accessories are included.

The CONTRACTOR'S bid shall include the purchase of all materials and equipment, including all applicable sales taxes, required to complete the project in its entirety.

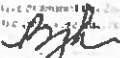
